


ECO SCHOOLS




SOROPTOMIST COMPETITION

SERVICE OF REMEMBRANCE



In 1938 I was one of three boys chosen to greet the Duchess of Abercorn during the opening ceremony for the newly renovated Omagh Academy. I was a hardworking pupil and in 1939 I left the Academy to attend Queens University Belfast. I joined the RAF and was killed in 1941.

The Omagh Academy community came together for a Service of Remembrance that took place in November. During the service, the attendees had the opportunity to remember and reflect. The solemn reading of the Roll of Honour, the recitation of 'In Flanders' Fields', and the playing of The Last Post and Reveille, were all poignant reminders of the sacrifices made. The stories of four past pupils whose names are engraved on the memorial plaque were also shared.

This occasion served as a reminder that Omagh Academy is just one small part of a bigger story. After the service, attendees walked past a memorial stone adorned with a wreath and a gallery of school photographs, taking time to pause at a photo from 1937 that featured a teenage boy named William George McDowell. His story was shared, and the school is grateful for his legacy.
