

Meeting on Wednesday afternoons from 3:30-4:30pm in Room 10, Digital Technology Club allows pupils from Years 8-10 to develop their understanding of technology and a variety of software applications.

Pupils have started with an introduction to basic programming using visual code blocks in Scratch. The Scratch environment allows pupils to gain an understanding of basic programming concepts such as sequence and iteration whilst allowing the creation of digital stories, games, and animations. Activities for next school term will include Game Design using GameMaker and introduction to programming in Python. The club also offers pupils the opportunity to catch up on work missed due to absence with support available if required. New members are always welcome.
